FROM FATHER SIMON



We will begin the season of Lent on Wednesday February 26, with ashes on our foreheads. What do we make of this smudging? Here at Queen of All Saints we have Masses at 6:30am, 8:30am and at 2pm as well as prayer services at 12 noon, 4:30pm and 7:30pm during which we have the imposition of ashes. It is safe to say that we have more people go to church on Ash Wednesday than on any other day of the year. The queues to receive the ashes in many churches are endless. Why? Why are ashes so popular?

Their popularity, I suspect, comes from the fact that as a symbol, ashes are blunt, primal and speak the language of the soul. Something inside each of us knows exactly why we take ashes: “Dust you are and to dust you shall return!” Ashes are dust and dust is soil, humus; humanity and humility come

from there. It is no accident that ashes have always been a major symbol within all religions. To put on ashes, to sit in ashes, is to say publicly and to yourself that you are reflective, in a penitential mode, that this is not “ordinary time” for you, that you are not in a season of celebration, that you are grieving some of the things you have done and lost, that some important work is going on silently within you.

To facilitate this growth within us, the Church encourages us to observe the three disciplines of Lent – almsgiving, fasting and prayer. The Parish Pastoral Council offers us several suggestions to observe these disciplines in a special way commemorating the 90th anniversary of our parish with a plan called ‘90 for 90’.

Just a further elaboration of these Lenten disciplines: almsgiving is generally understood as giving money or goods to those in need but in a broader context almsgiving can also be understood to include other kinds of charitable acts of service. We might also want to consider forgiving someone against whom we have held a grudge for years and approaching the sacrament of reconciliation that is offered on Saturdays from 8:30am and every Monday in Lent from 7 to 8pm.

Fasting - yes, it is that time of the year when we consider the question “what am I giving up for Lent?” The purpose is not to grovel in guilt, or become smug about will power and self-restraint, but to free ourselves from bondage to our appetites so as to be available to God. Lent isn’t simply about us “giving up” something. The real grace is when we recognize that Lent is a season in which God wants to give us something. God wants to help us transform our lives.

Prayer is particularly important in Lent, as we strive to set right our relationship with God. Prayer helps us do that by keeping open communication with God - we talk to God and we await and listen to God’s response. As we present our needs, we recognize our dependence on God and grow in our trust in his promise to provide what we really need. As a parish community, in light of my letter last weekend, I ask you to pray especially for our parish as a whole and for those involved in this disturbing investigation. May our prayer be for a resolution to this incident and a healing of all concerned.

May our journey through Lent provide us an opportunity to walk more closely with Jesus, who desires our presence, sometimes more than we desire his.

Lenten Regulations

Each year the holy season of Lent provides us with a special time of grace and spiritual renewal so that we may become better instruments in sharing the Gospel message. All members of the Christian faithful in their own way are bound to do penance in virtue of divine law.

The faithful are encouraged during Lent to attend daily Mass, receive Holy Communion, participate in penance services, and receive sacramental absolution. We are also encouraged to take part in public and private exercises of piety, give generously to works of religion and charity, perform acts of kindness toward the sick, aged, and the poor, to practice voluntary self-denial, especially regarding food, drink and worldly amusements, and to pray more fervently, particularly for the intentions of the Holy Father.

Fasting and Abstinence

All adults up to their 60th year are required to fast. According to Canon 97, #1, a person who has completed the 18th year, is an adult. The day of fast during Lent is Ash Wednesday, February 26 and during the Triduum, Good Friday, April 10.

All persons 14 years of age or older are required to abstain from meat products on Fridays during Lent, as well as on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Meat and products including meat are not to be eaten.

What does 90 mean to you?

PRAYER

- 90 minutes of added prayer per day or week
- 90 minutes of adoration (Monday evenings and Holy Thursday)
- pray for 90 people (even if it's one sentence!)
- journal 90 words of reflection on a prayer, scripture or other inspiration
- read 90 chapters of the Bible (89 chapters in the Gospels, only 2 per day!)
- read 90 Psalms
- make a list of 90 things you are grateful for
- make a list of 90 people you are grateful for
- pray 90 beads of the rosary (only 2 rosaries!)
- 90 seconds of conversation per day with God
- read 90 pages of a spiritual book
- listen to 90 minutes of worship music

FASTING

- 90 minutes of no electronics in the house
- 90 minutes of silence in the house
- limit electronics or media to 90 minutes per day or week
- fast from inactivity by adding 90 minutes of exercise per week
- spend 90 minutes outside with nature instead of indoors
- replace 90 minutes or miles of your commute with walking or biking
- donate or recycle 90 items you don't need anymore
- give up 90 of something (2 per day) to break a habit (cigarettes, drinks, snacks, etc.)
- skip \$90 of splurges
- listen to someone for 90 seconds without talking
- wait 90 seconds before saying or posting something unkind

- donate \$90 to a charity of your choice



Fr. Corey Brost, C.S.V., is a member of the Clerics of St. Viator, a religious order of brothers, priests and lay associates. He joined the order in 1987 and has served since then as a religious educator, classroom teacher and high school administrator. He served as president of St. Viator High School in Arlington Heights from 2013-2016 and left with support from the Viatorians to work full time as an advocate for immigrant rights and interfaith bridge-building.

At present, Father Brost is executive director of Viator House of Hospitality, a northwest suburban interfaith program that provides a home and services for up to 25 young men, 18-23 years old, who've fled their homelands, are seeking asylum in the U.S. and have no family to live with while they await their legal proceedings.



Additionally, Fr. Brost co-founded the Children of Abraham Coalition in 2010 to counter the increasing faith-based prejudice he saw in our nation and around the world. The Coalition, a 501(c) 3 non-profit located in the northwest suburbs, plans events for all ages that promote interfaith relationships, reverence and literacy. It is governed by a board of Muslim, Jewish and Christian leaders, one third of them high school and college age.



Stewardship during Lent A time to recommit to our parish

If you are a regular reader of this page you know that our parish has much to be grateful for and a wonderful capacity to face the challenges of the future.

Thanks to the ongoing generosity of our parishioners through our Sunday, Christmas and Easter collections, and our one and only parish-wide fundraiser, the United Parish Program, **our parish operations have been able to stay in the black in recent years, with little to spare.**

However, on the capital side we encountered a series of major expenses in recent years, including **the replacement of the basilica ceiling extensive repairs to the basilica bell tower, the completion of Phase III of our capital campaign, as well as a host of other water-related repairs which tend to afflict buildings the same age as ours.**

Fortunately, we were able to pay for those expenses by drawing on our savings (our endowments), **which were prudently set aside by those who came before us for precisely this type of unforeseen problem.** We were able to begin repairs promptly before our problems got worse.

The good news is that we've addressed our immediate problems. The challenging news is that we are left with a serious hole in our savings. **Now it's time to address that problem.**

We need to move from mere break-even operations to instead generating at least five million dollars total surplus over the next ten years to replenish our savings and restore our parish's financial position.

We will continue talking about this throughout the year, since our parish members deserve the whole story, including how we can achieve this goal in the generous spirit that has always characterized the people of Queen of All Saints Parish.

Please consider how you can help achieve our parish financial needs, for the present and for the future.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated at 1:30pm two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.
